WATCH

A “WATCH” means CONDITIONS ARE BEING MONITORED THAT COULD AFFECT the Island. During a “WATCH” phase you can begin planning for your safety and potential evacuation. Keep in mind a “WATCH” may be cancelled.

EMERGENCY OPERATION CENTER

BUILDING 3 – MAINTENANCE SHOP 1st Floor by Elevator.

PREPARATIONS

1. 1 gal Water per person
2. Prescriptions
3. Clothes 3-4 days.
4. Cash
5. Flashlights
6. Batteries
7. Radios
8. Food for 3 days
9. Blankets/Pillows
10. Toilet Paper (2pp)
11. Personal items
12. Charged Cell Phones
13. LOCK UP UNIT
14. TAKE KEYS
15. Call/Text Family

A “WARNING” means CONDITIONS ARE EXPECTED WITHIN 3 HOURS. Monitor Radio or TV Stations below for updated information. This phase will be accompanied by our County Emergency Siren System. Guests and Owners should determine whether to evacuate or remain in their unit.

EVACUATING:

MAUI EMERGENCIES TSUNAMI'S

A Tsunami can occur without warning but are commonly generated from a major earthquake. A Tsunami is a large body of water that is stirred up in the ocean as earthquake fault plates are activated. It can build or diminish as it travels across the ocean. NOAA has buoy's in the Ocean in various areas that notify us of an impending Tsunami.

HURRICANES

Hurricanes are winds in excess of 80mph that develop in the Pacific Ocean off Mexico. It can take 3-5 days to reach Hawaii. As it approaches NOAA and Civil Defense monitors its progress and will activate a WATCH. MV Security and Management will implement our response plan at that time.

EARTHQUAKES

Earthquakes occur with no warning. Depending on its location, staff will open the Emergency Operations Center to monitor whether a tsunami has been generated.
