<p align="center">SIRENS SOUND ATTACK WARNING</p> <p align="center">EMERGENCY ALERT ADVISORY</p>	<p align="center">GET INSIDE</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. If you are indoors – stay indoors well away from windows. 2. If outdoors, seek immediate shelter or return to your unit. 3. DO NOT look at the flash of light. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are NO designated blast or fallout shelters in Hawaii. • Surviving a nuclear detonation requires sheltering in resistant structures. • Take immediate action. • The “flash” will damage eyes. 	
<p align="center">WIRELESS EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM</p> <p align="center">BRILLIANT WHITE LIGHT – FLASH IS OBSERVED</p>		<p align="center">STAY INSIDE</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Remain sheltered until: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. You are advised it’s safe. b. Two (2) weeks pass. c. You are advised it is safe to leave for short periods to get food, water, medical care. 2. Electrical, water and other utilities may be severely disrupted or unavailable. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shelter 14 days after radioactive fallout. It is critical to do so. • You “may” need to briefly leave shelters to locate supplies. This should be minimal time. • Emergency Management will assess radiation levels and advise when sheltering can discontinue. •
			<p align="center">STAY TUNED</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Listen to local AM/FM radio stations for official information. 2. Cell phone, television, radio and internet services will be severely disrupted or unavailable. 3. Small portable walkie-talkies may give you communication with nearby shelters.
